The Local Government Unit of Santa Fe through the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) allocated ₱ 250,000.00 for Aid to Individual in Crisis Situation (AICS) that provides direct financial/cash assistance to individuals and families in crisis or difficult situation. CHILD AND YOUTH WELFARE PROGRAM

For the year 2019, the funds for the Local Council for the Protection of Children is ₱ 707,634,058.

The MSWD Office focuses on the programs and services for children, as one of the office vision "The municipality where social welfare programs and services for the poor and disadvantaged individuals, families and communities are being generously delivered; focusing on children's welfare, investing on human resources; thereby empowering and capacitating them to improve their quality of life and cope up social challenges."

Improvement of Child Development Centers and equipping these centers are regular projects of the LGU.

PROVISION OF PROGRAM MATERIALS TO CDC









The municipality of Santa Fe implemented Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP) funded by the Department of Social Welfare and Development Office. To support this program, the LGU provide supplies and materials for the use of the program. In 2019, the LGU purchased 17 units of small refrigerators and 1 unit of freezer to ensure non-spoilage of SFP foodstuff.

WOMEN WELFARE PROGRAM

There are two (2) Women Associations organized in the municipality of Santa Fe, the Provincial Women's League of Romblon (PWLR) and the Kalipunan ng Liping Pilipina (KALIPI). PWLR is a provincial affiliated association while KALIPI is a national affiliated women organization.

In 2018, a request for a Multi-Purpose Building for Women Empowerment and Livelihood Center to DIWA Party List through Cong. Emiline Aglipay Villar was approved in the amount of TWO MILLION PESOS (₱ 2,000.000.00). The project was finished in 2019.





To date, the women associations has their own livelihood activities. The DSWD and DOLE are the national agencies that provided capital support.

OLDER PERSONS (OP) AND PERSON WITH DISABILITY (PWD) WELFARE PROGRAM

For 2019, the total funds for this sector in the municipality of Santa Fe is ₱ 739, 314.58. ₱ 299, 314.58 and ₱ 440,000.00 for PWD and Older Persons respectively.

The LGU has an existing Office of the Senior Citizens Affairs (OSCA) and a Focal Persons for Persons with Disability Affairs Office (PDAO).

Currently, the municipality has a total of 486 registered PWDs and 2,017 older persons aging from 60 and above. To date, the municipality has 1,545 senior citizens benefiting social pension cash grant. Hereunder is the breakdown of Senior Citizens Social Pensioners.
